!! Match this Saturday: March 3rd: full match of six stages; registration cut off 9:30

**Gun Safe Humidity Control**

When I added a new gun safe to accommodate my growing gun collection, I knew its location in my home would be a problem. The only available space for its size and accessibility would be in the garage. Obviously, the garage environment was not an ideal location for a moisture free safe. That location would lead to a battle with humidity and potential rust. As soon as I finished loading the safe with guns I added a dehumidifier.

This type requires activation by plugging it into an AC electrical outlet for a few hours prior to use. It will then absorb moisture until the internal desiccant becomes saturated. I found that this occurred in a short time period, especially if the safe door was opened frequently. It requires some discipline to remember to check the saturation and reactivate when needed.



After discovering some rust spots on a couple of rifles stored in the safe, I started looking for some other means of controlling the humidity. There are several types of heating devices available that are

recommended for the job. Maybe I don't completely understand the technical details behind these products or, as I suspect, they are primarily intended to be used where climatic temperatures are more reasonable than Houston's. Placing a heater inside a safe that is sitting in a 90 degree plus environment just did not make a lot of sense to me.

I ran across a device that appeared to be ideally suited for the job, the **Eva-Dry Electric Petite Portable Dehumidifier, Model EDV-1100**. It requires an electrical connection inside the safe and my safe was equipped with one. If it had not had an outlet, I would have drilled a ¼" hole in the back of the safe and run an electric cord through it. The unit was available from several sources including Amazon and eBay. Prices range from \$30 to \$50 including shipping.



The next day after installing the Eva-Dry in my safe I checked the water level in its internal collection bucket. It was ¾ full. I emptied it and did not check it again for 2 or 3 days. The water level was again more than half full. It took about a week for the unit to finish drawing water from the air in the safe. Normally, I don't open the safe during the week, only in preparation for a Saturday shoot. It now usually shows just a trace of water in the bucket which indicates that there is little or no moisture present in the safe. My rust problem appears to have been eliminated. I certainly recommend this device to anyone living in the Gulf Coast area who has such a need.

I print mine and tear it in pieces.



## Open Range Information Here is the report on the long range match held today.

It turned out to be a beautiful day for shooting long range at TRR today. Granted, there was some fog when we arrived for practice, making the 350 yard target pretty hard to see, but when match time rolled around the fog had lifted. Early in the match the clouds parted and the sun came out making for a beautiful day. We had 8 shooters at the match, including some first time shooters. Neshannock Leo came out and fired a few practice rounds but then his gun decided to longer cooperate. Seems the hammer wouldn't catch on the trigger sear so he stuck around and helped spot, but wasn't able to shoot. Our thanks to Nile City Slick who also came out but didn't shoot. He helped spot and also brought his ATV which was a big help when going down range to paint the targets. Its a long walk down to the 350 yard target and back!

Match winner today by tie breaker was Blackpowder Burn, who we have given the nickname of "Sneaky Squirrel". Seems he let the Blind Squirrel (GW Ketchum) think he was out in front and going to win again, but on the last target, the Sneaky Squirrel came from behind with a splendid performance on the 350 yard target with 4 out of 5 bulls eyes to tie GW with a score of 41. In the case of a tie score at our long range matches, the tie breaker goes to the shooter with the best score on the most distant target, therefore, Blackpowder Burn was declared the match winner. Congratulations to both, though, for some very good shooting.

Some good scores were turned in by Dusty Bottoms and Little Britches, both shooting long range for the first time. They were using a borrowed rifle but now seem hooked as they were spotted searching the internet for a good deal on a suitable rifle. Hats off also to Ramblin' Gambler for shooting with a rifle with sights that weren't really made to be adjusted on the fly. Seems they can be adjusted, with the help of a screwdriver and maybe a small hammer, but that's a hard way to transition between different target distances. For the last target we put a chair on the top of the berm and Gambler could aim at the chair and hit the target. Talk about "Kentucky Windage"!

# Fairplay

Brass Failures: a bit of history: when I started under the mentoring of Lady Wolf and Lone Wolf they used nickel brass for revolver and brass-colored brass for rifle. As they were shooting two different powder loads this helped keep them easily identified. As they knew about all things SASS I followed suit. I ordered 500 each of the two types of brass and have kept to this method since I started shooting in 2002.

After the Feb 4 shoot and while depriming I noticed I had pretty much a 50% failure rate with the nickel brass. Straight brass ones—not so much. All of the problems were cracks (splits) in the case mouths. I did have a few case blow out where the crack ran from the rim to almost the mouth and I remember them as the ones that were hard to extract.

As I am now rapidly losing brass to age and 'fair wear and tear' I need to look in another direction (I did run these cases through the annealer multiple times but *all things must come to an end*).

My new method which many of you already do it to color code the heads of the cases with a marker. I use *red for rifle* and *black for revolver*. Since **Slashwood's** rifle load is different he gets a *green stripe*. These permanent marker colors will come off in the wet tumbler so I don't have to worry about separating them before I reload






