Summer dress is now an optional choice: due to our (in)famous Texas summer weather we are offering a summer clothing option. You can, if you choose, wear T-shirts, shorts and non-cowfolk footwear. The Board realizes that a goodly number of our members can have major medical complications in high heat/humidity situations and would hate to see the matches stopped while they are life-flighted off of the range.

Match Reports:

April 28: what a great bunch of cowboys turned out to shoot! We had 3 posses totaling 45 shooters so I think the spring time attendance has arrived. Some folks of note: Shotgun Willie Nelson was making his first appearance while Wild Card Wayne, Macon A. Longshot and The Major are returning after a bit of a vacation—good to have them at the range.

BPB was the author of the stages again and big thanks to **Lorelei Longshot** for printing, laminating and posting the voluminous start lines. As usual at TRR folks step up when they see a need.

Did get a bit warm towards the end and Suzie Q made sure we had the fans running plus TJD and I provided water and Gatorade for everyone. We'll be having liquids available from here on out so watch each other and be sure to keep hydrated. May 5 match had TJD writing the stages and everyone had a great time in what has to be perfect weather, though by the end we remembered why Phil Sheridan wanted to live in Hell and rent out Texas. While coming in through the rain and muddy roads was a bit of excitement, once we got to the range is was magnificent. Of the 9 clean matches shot 5 of them were from Posse 2—we may not be all that fast but we're accurate (OK a few were both but for the rest of us . . .)

Three posses meant the day was one of our largest this year. At one point it looked like a demolition derby as gun carts crossed paths.

Safety:

Maintenance Matters by Rawhide



I've switched to synthetic oil and grease for my guns. Won't gum up in cold weather. I bought one quart of oil which should last a lifetime and can use it other places to also. Also have been using a product called **Rusteprufe** on my guns . It does a great job at keeping surface rust off my guns in our



humid environment even if ya don't clean them after each match. Seems to last longer than silicone.

Maintenance: gun cart

Grease the wheels occasionally and other moving parts that fold up or down. Good place to use that synthetic oil and grease to justify costs. The folks that have the small chrome bicycle wheels need to clean them occasionally to prevent rust. I came up with that idea as I just spent time cleaning mine which had started getting rust on them.
