Notes on Matches: The past two matches had several similar characteristics: both had a 4-wheel drive kind of feeling on the drive to and from the rain. Weather was a bit cool but nothing to complain about (I still remember how hot last summer was!)

Range maintenance was not needed as far as grass and weed whacking were concerned and the ground was soft and while we didn't lose anyone, several cowboys sink into the bogs at the south end of the range. All in all it beat freezing weather and 3 feet of snow—we're lucky to be able to shoot year round in our neck of the woods. We did realign categories by replacing CD with Sharpshooter. **Cherokee Jones, BPB and Osage Mike** shot the new category and liked it so we may have come up with a win-win situation by having something for the long range shooters and keeping from shooting a moose down range of the berms.

We welcomed several new and returning shooters to the club: **Devlin McBride**, Allen Anderson, Cowboy, JJ Mcgee and Pappy Ray Mcgee were enjoying CAS with us in January.

Just a quick final note on categories: we had 36 shooters and 30 of them ended up as 1st or 2nd in their category.

Long Range

We had a discussion between the Willow Hole management (aka **Def Willie**) and the TRR Long Range Brain Trust (such as it is, and what there is of it) after the WHC match last Saturday. Unfortunately, the continued wet weather is

making it difficult to make any progress in setting up long range facilities at Willow



Hole. As weather permits, our intent is to:

- 1. Survey the WHC location for placement of target backstops/berms. If we can dodge rain, we hope to do that this week.
- 2. Disassemble the railroad ties serving as berm frames at TRR and move to WHC. Again, Ma Nature permitting, we hope to do that the week of Feb. 25th.
- 3. Set up our existing gong and silhouette targets at WHC and have a match there in March.
- 4. Firing line shade/rain cover
- a. We will initially use the Easy-Ups we have now for this purpose. As time permits, we'll work on permanent cover for the firing line.
- 5. We also plan to purchase additional gong and silhouette targets as funds permit. This will allow us to accommodate larger relays of shooters and/or go longer between required trips downrange to paint targets.
- 6. Also considering purchasing some target impact sensors/lights. These will flash a strobe upon sensing an impact on a target. This would potentially take the place of spotters for calling hits on simple hit/miss targets like silhouettes.

All-in-all, we have some grandiose plans for the future. With a little time and elbow grease, we'll have a really nice facility for folks to come enjoy – and try to unseat the reigning "Old Blind Squirrel" from his throne.

If you have some free time in your schedule, or would like to take a trip to scenic North Zulch (I'm still looking for South Zulch) consider coming out a lending a hand. We're always looking for another sucker friendly, energetic sould to help!

Sorta Long Range

Now that we can no longer shoot *real, "growed up"* rifles at TRR, Osage pointed out to us that there are several clubs that shoot what is termed "Sharpshooter" category. This is shooting your revolvers at the normal rifle targets, and your pistol caliber rifles at what we were using for Cody Dixon targets. We tried it out at the last match and had a hoot with it. Now don't get "skeered" as **Rawhide** would say – it ain't that hard!

And to make it easier for you, there is this little knob or pointy thing on the end of your revolver and rifle barrels that help to point them at the targets. We've discovered that if you put that in the middle of the target, the bullets actually can reach 10 to 15 yards from the muzzle of your hand cannons, and even out to 50 or 60 yards for the rifles! Who woulda' thunk it!?

Several folks came out to practice day to sight in their rifles for Sharpshooter, even with the dang cold temperatures we had last Saturday. In truth, it shouldn't take much change in sight settings. If you have your rifle sighted reasonably well for our regular targets, I'll bet you can also hit the Sharpshooter targets. Unless you use really "mouse phart" loads like **Rawhide** (he's just cheap, uses about 2 flakes of Trail Boss per round), you'll probably only have to hold slightly higher to hit without a sight adjustment. In many cases (such as me) no change was necessary at all – a center hold hits center on both targets. Of course, I do tend to use a skoosh more *real* powder than most folks. ©

Adopt A Stage

As cheyenne mentioned in the last TRWG, we'd like to see folks adopt a stage at the TRR range. It just involves taking 5 minutes to check it over before a match to make sure the counting sticks, gun mats, etc. are in place and trash picked up. Also keep watch on the physical condition and if repairs are necessary, let someone on the BOD know about it so it can be taken care of. If you would like to do the repairs yourself, we'd be really happy, and would pay for the cost of materials. Extra decorations and ambience would also be great if you have some ideas.

Many Eyes find all the Problems: GW and his Merry Elves are gearing up for the Spring Repairing Season. This is where we tackle those areas that need to be fixed, replaced or burned to the ground.

Right now the floor of the **Saloon** is in danger of putting one of the shooters into the dirt (below the floor). Worse case: the shooter ends up

straddling a floor joist with his feet ALMOST reaching the ground . . . Ouch!

Saloon, part 2: the bar needs to be lowered for our height-challenged shooters. It is unsafe to have these cowboys shoot while standing on their tip-toes. This won't be a structural job, more of a cosmetic one.

Stage brass catching sheets or netting: Way back when the Jail was built we were planning on adding the angled 4x8 sheets to all the stages. These sheets are used to catch the brass that is thrown forward. A similar idea has been suggested to use netting which could be pulled in after each shooter. This netting would not he anywhere as heavy as the plywood and not warp or distort from the weather.


To this end <u>we would like to hear of any concerns you have about things that need attending to</u>, either repair, replacement or removal. Let us know so we can get them on the list.

Accoutrements for your leather: when we cowfolk 'saddle up' at the beginning of a match our belt usually has two holsters and either a shotgun slide or separate shotgun belt. That's about all you need to 'go forth and whip the bad guys.'

If you check out the long time members of SASS you might discover a few handy additional items.

One of my necessities is a pistol cartridge slide. These can be found on both shotgun belts as well as a small slide for your main belt. I am finding I am *jacking out* at least one rifle round per match these days and it's much quicker to pull a round out of my slide than reach down on the ground, keeping the rifle pointing in a

safe direction while I recover the ejected live cartridge; all my posse members <u>really</u> appreciate it, too. But wait, you say you have loops on your belt—fine, they work as well but I find that a full row of cartridges weigh quite a bit and if I only load a couple the empty row look somehow funny to me personal preference and all.



Another item you'll see is a screwdriver holster usually on the back side of one of the holsters. You keep a screwdriver near and dear to deal with jams in both your pistols and rifle as well as using it as a toothpick. Many of these screwdrivers will have a bit of antler used as the handle

As always, you have to keep from adding too much stuff or you'll weigh yourself down to the point of not being able to move 'quick like a bunny.'




We have numbered tiles with numbers that correspond to the numbers in
