That means

TRR will be providing about \$3,000 worth of funding to the project, which will go a long way toward building a shade structure, shooting tables, additional targets, necessary road improvements, parking etc. WHC will be providing a similar amount of money to the project.

So, we've made a great start, and a big round of thanks are due to Fairplay John, Bristlecone Jan, Rawhide, Ellie Mae, GW Ketchum, Suzie Q, Osage Mike, Def Willie, Walter Durbin, and especially Doc Bury'em. He's a great host and will be joining us at the monthly matches. I suspect he'll teach us all lots of lessons with his long range expertise.

If you want to join us, and have an RV, there's a nice dry part of the pasture where we can set up camp. It makes a great way to spend a weekend by shooting cowboy on Saturday, hanging out with all us reprobates Saturday evening, and shooting long range on Sunday.

#### TRR Cowboy Silhouette Matches

The Cowboy Silhouette Matches for both pistol caliber rifle and rimfire rifle will be moving to the Sunday following the first Saturday Cowboy match each month starting in April. The schedule change is made possible by the Long Range Matches moving to Willow Hole on the Sunday following their monthly Cowboy match. Moving the Cowboy Silhouette matches allows us to not interfere with the practice day activities on the second Saturday of each month. Cowboy Silhouette matches require frequent down range activities to repaint the silhouette targets. By having these matches on a different day, we will avoid interruptions with those trying to get in some good practice on the Cowboy range.

Starting on April 7, we will hold Silhouette matches for both pistol caliber and rimfire rifles. These matches use the half size silhouette animals at distances from 40 yards out to 100 yards. We will continue to have separate categories for both supported and off hand firing positions so those wanting to shoot from a rest will be able to do so. Both single shot and lever action rifles may be used. Plan to come out and join us for a different type of shooting that can be a lot of fun.

## <u>Thunder Hole</u> Long Range

The rifle caliber long range events have moved to the Willow Hole Cowboys range. Development of the range is still a work in progress, but enough has been done to allow shooting to begin. A practice and sight in day was held on St. Patrick's Day with 15 cowboys and cowgirls attending. Long range matches will be held on the Sunday following the third Saturday of each month starting in April. These will begin with our normal gong type matches and will later include a BPCR Silhouette match as well. Targets are at 100, 200, 300, 400, and 500 yards. A target will be added at 600 yards in the near future. Attached are a couple of pictures from the practice day and the first shots fired at the new long range facility.

If there are buds on the trees ... can range maintenance be far behind? Now that the grass is beginning to grow we turn our attention to keeping the range mowed and weed-eaten (-ate?)



With Work Days now moved to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of the Month we still have to

come up with a date for taking care of all things green. We are going to keep the grass cutting days on the weekdays before the Saturday of the match. Since this will fall on those with flexible work schedules as well as we retired folks we want to make it as painless as possible.

This Wednesday, March 20, we will have our first Mowing Day. It will start around 8:00 a.m. but we won't turn you away if you arrive later—many hands make light work and all of that.

I'll be cutting grass on **Cowboy Bob** so we are looking for help in the weed eating areas. Areas needing a bit of trimming are all around the buildings, stages and in and about the targets; it's hard to get the riding mower into the tight target areas. If you are physically limited there is always filling the water tower. The plan is to be done by noon or earlier.

**Bee careful with wax:** back in the dark ages before writing was invented I purchased two pounds of bee's wax thinking I might try making my own bullet lube someday. I didn't know much about mixing stuff together but bee's wax seemed to be in a lot of the recipes.

Time pasted and all I found of use for it was a small pea-sized

sphere in my lead pot would do wondrous things in cleaning out the junk in the lead; stir it in, try not to smell the fumes and in no time the lead would be clean and I would commence to casting. Folks, it takes a

very, very long time to use up 2 pounds of bee's wax that way. I had hardly put a dent in the zip lock bags they came in; worse, the wax would soften in the Texas heat and migrate all over the casting table. Time to repackage!

Turns out easier said than done. My plan was to put the baggies in a double boiler (over electric

on gas heat) and once the wax had liquefied I would pout if into some plastic screw top containers . . . what could go wrong?

As it turned out many things: first, the baggies didn't stand up to temperatures needed to melt the wax so now I have a big pan of melted wax with pieces of baggie throughout. I lost quite a bit of wax while fishing out these pieces.

> Next, pouring hot wax into the small mouths of the containers turned out to be above my skill set (did I mention I was doing all this inside in the kitchen?) While I got a large part of it into the containers both sat in rather thick hardening puddles of wax. I need to scrape this wax off the counter and back into the pot. The second pour was much better. Once cooled the tops were screwed on and I was done—or was I?

> Nope, still had to clean out the pot—and I was informed this needed to be done elsewhere—like Timbuktu (which brings up a little ditty I best not share here.) You

can't really wipe all the wax out of the pot, there will still be a thin film inside. Oil cuts it and since this was an outdoor pot motor oil, just a bit, was used and a bunch of paper towels. After repeated applications of oil and scrubbing with the towels the pan did pass muster but we'll never be able to eat out it.

Thus is my one and only encounter with bee's wax.
