Firearm up-grade report

Aftermarket Extractor for Marlin 1894: Ranger Point's new extractor costs about 3 times the price of the EOM so why buy it? For some of us just being able to spend large amounts of money on something new is reason enough. For others the advantages, perceived or actual, will be worth the expenditure.

If you ever chambered a round in a Marlin 94 you know the lever will smoothly go forward but when you bring it back there is a definite 'hitch' at about the halfway point. This is caused by the rim and the extractor coming together. Not enough to throw you off but it will be noticed. I always felt I had to hold the rifle very firmly to keep it on target while closing the lever.



Now Ranger Point, which is all of 5 miles from my house—very near 10-Ring Gun Store on Jones Rd, will give you any number of reasons for buying their extractor but eliminating the hitch resulting in a very smooth chambering operation is reason enough for me to have made the purchase (that and they were having a 15% off sale at the time.)

Installation is simple, remove the bolt from the rifle, knock a pin out of the bolt from the bottom, remove the old extractor, replace with new one, pin goes back in (from the top) and reassemble bolt and lever. If it takes more than 10 minutes it's because you can't find the proper screwdriver or your brass hammer has taken a walk somewhere.

NOTE: their extractor is under tension and if you don't hold the spring in with your fingers you can launch it across the room (they do include a second spring *just in case*. You also get a cute little punch with which to remove the

pin; it may or may not be long enough after reading a number of reviews.

Ranger Point has a video showing how it's done <u>CLICK HERE</u> to see it. Watching it a couple of times will show you how easy it is

Come by any time I'm on the range and see for yourself the difference it makes.

[As always, I have no association with this company other than a happy customer and should I be caught or killed, the Secretary will disavow any knowledge of me.]



I decided to do something about the recoil of my shotgun--cowboy action shooting is doing a number on my twice repaired rotator cuff.

I did some research on the internet and most folks were using a mechanical recoil reducer in the stock of the shotgun.

Did another search and seems only Midway was carrying the Dead Mule which is was the one most recommended.

Price was a bit higher than I hoped but was in line with what manufacturer charges and I could get free shipping.

Turns out my shotgun, Coyote Cap's Model 99 SxS doesn't have a hole in the back of the stock-cheap Chinese product

Now here's the fun part, decided to drill the hole first to be sure I could do it. Took a bit of time but got it drilled without coming out of the side of the stock.

Went back in to order and did a final check on the product and discovered it needed a 7/8" hole!! Shucks!!

Went back out and was able to enlarge the hole--getting it started was not pretty but as my wife say, "Only you will know it's there." And that's the problem: I'll know it.

I saw only one problem: the recoil pad is very soft and the Dead Mule might want to back out and push against it creating a bulge in the center of the pad. I looked at Midway and they really didn't have any butt plate spacers. If worse comes to worst I'll fabricate one out of some thin metal or space age polymer (plastic)

Now to wait a week or so--free shipping does have one catch--it takes longer to get here than the shipping that costs \$\$ but being retired I have more time than \$\$.

I'll keep you posted on how it goes

UP-DATE: turns out it arrived in 3 days which was a welcome surprise. (Did also learn the stock was made of mahogany of which I am allergic. Eyes were almost swollen shut the day after drilling the hole.) Did some fine tuning of the depth of the hole and the Dead Mule dropped right in. Did have to make a metal plate to cover the hole; inlet around the plate and was able to fit that under the recoil pad

Now to the 64 Thousand Question: does it work? I would say yes, I shot it multiple times and recoil seems to be much less though I don't know if it's because of me 'wanting' it to work. The idea that the brain can convince the person the new product does make a difference whether true or not—the so-called **placebo effect**

In any event stop by anytime and test it out yourself.
