Our next mowing day is Thursday, July 25

This Thursday we are calling all worker bees for a few hours of 'fun and games' in the hot and humid Texas summer weather—yes it's weed-whacking time again.

Standard list of jobs:

- Edge around all the structures and boardwalk
- Water tower needs topping off—two barrels should do it
- Looking for anyone wanting to take some trash home for disposal—bag or two per person would be a great help

Remember to bring some liquid refreshment as we're on the cusp of summer.

Taking Pictures in Bring Sun: now and then we all feel the need to snap a picture or two of our trip back into the Old West: a fancy looking Pard, a new gun cart or just the brand new hole in your brand new boots (hope they can save the toe!)

The pretty much best sky to have is overcast—no harsh shadows and colors photograph very close to their actual hues. Next to total darkness the worst situation is a bright sky, the kind we usually have during our matches. Here are a few thoughts and suggestions.

Actively consider where the shadows will be in the picture. If you are inside do everything possible to keep the bright outdoor light from being in the picture—most of our cameras will equal out the brightness resulting in overly dark objects inside structures.

But if you can do/remember only one thing use the camera's flash. I know that may sound like the wrong way to go: too much sun so we'll add a bit more—but the fill flash will do a great job of keeping the inside from photographing too dark.

Below are two shots, first without flash, second with. See how the flash helps out.





Plus a great shot of Posse 2 (even with bright sky at the top opening:



This is not 14: what you are looking at is a "1" and a "4." They will be attached to our two generators so we will know which one to run on the 1st and 4th Saturdays of the month.

BPB wants to alternate them and this is the simplest way we could think of that would be easy to see, long lasting and not cost an arm and a leg. They are located on the ends of the generators nearest the door and can be moved left and right as needed

Barrel Leading: if you have leading that doesn't respond to the normal bore cleaner and patches you might want to look into the Lewis Lead Remover which uses a very fine copper mesh to physically remove the lead. They are very proud of them when it comes to buying



them. They are caliber-specific and run just under \$40 + shipping at Brownells and Midway.



A poor man's method uses brass tobacco pipe screen filters and a tight fitting jag—I can always double up on the screens to get an extremely tight fit. I use 3/4" size for .38/.357/9 mm and the 1" for .44/.45. The overall price is much lower than the commercial kit but I feel does an equally good job on leading. Fifty screens runs about \$7 with free shipping and individual jags

can be had a Academy for a few dollars, if that.

With either method you do have to apply elbow grease as this is not a "one and done" method. If I have the time I'll start off with a wet patch of Kroil Oil and allow this to work overnight (see next article.) I'm all for letting chemistry do the *heavy lifting* where I can.

Another method to deal with barrel leading: there are times when you lead your barrel and it seems nothing will work. I know that the element Mercury will work but that is like moving to Chernobyl for your health—Mercury, Hg, comes with its own set of major health issues (never mind we played with it in chemistry class bare handed in high school—ruined a number of gold senior rings, too.)

I have found if you're willing to spend some time doing other things you might want to give this a try: after doing all you can do with your normal cleaning routine run a wet patch of Kroil down the barrel, place the rifle/pistol horizontal and go off and leave it for a day. Kroil is a penetrating oil and given enough time will wick between the leading and the barrel making removal easy.





Now here is something I fell into: I still had some leading and did the wet patch treatment a second time but forgot about the weekend match. I went on and shot the pistols as is and upon inspection found the leading gone—guess the blast and passing bullet took care of the remaining stuff.

Along with Kroil, Liquid Wrench gets high marks but WD-40 is seen as a poor penetrator.

Now from the Chuckwagon

Changes in your diet... for the Better! I ran across an interesting product in my searches for sourdough bread. BTW: the bread production is doing fine and tastes great considering all that is in the loves are water,



flour and 1½ teaspoons of salt plus the starter that started out as flour and water.

What I found was a product that does a fantastic job of mimicking chicken strips https://www.butlerfoods.com/soycurls.html While no animals died in making this stuff it has the mouth-feel of chicken and no taste to speak of so it picks up the flavors of the sauce you put on it. It's totally vegan which Violet says is better for me than a big thick Whataburger (if they are going to still make them now that they have sold out).

I see the Soy Curls as separate food, not one that is trying to take the place of meat—this thought process works well for me (same as turkey bacon is not in competition with real pig bacon.)



Prep is simple: soak the strips in water for 10 minutes, drain them (instructions say to press all the water out but I just use them from the colander.) A tablespoon of oil in a non-stick skillet and brown them over medium-high heat. Takes about 3 minutes.

After that douse them with BBQ or your favorite sauce, let everything come up to temp and that's it. I'm partial to General Tso's chicken so that's the sauce I also use along with BBQ.

Fourth of a bag is a meal for me (**Violet** hasn't tried them yet—she's says if they didn't come out of the ark they aren't going into her mouth) so I get to eat them all.

And the best thing is you can season them so they taste just like chicken!
