RO I Class in was a great learning experience. **TJD** did he usual magnificent job of teaching the material in a fun and meaningful way. More than one all the students were awake at the same time.

The caliber of the questions showed the students came to learn. **Jack** was able to give meaningful answers that explained the "whys and wherefores" behind the rules. We even learned about **RO III's** which is not to be confused with RO Instructors. Ask any of the graduates about RO III thinking if you don't already know about it.

In a side note I sat in what I thought was going to be the back row—Jack set up in a different place than I thought, putting me on the front row—no sleep for me!

Status of Stage 2 rebuild: As mentioned in emails the Gallows was just not 'making it' as a popular stage, be it the too narrow platform or the numerous steps the shooters had to negotiate.

We asked if members would like to wholly or in part finance a new structure and the response was amazing. Less than 12 hours later we had numerous offers of substantial amounts and we thank all who displayed that *Cowboy Way* in supporting TRR.

Yesterday we sent out pictures from the work party that got the old stuff removed from the Stage 2 area. We should be ready to start construction as soon as the blueprinted are finalized

Making the 1872 Open Tops more reliable: no question the Open Tops 'drip' with style points.



Nothing says Cowboy Action Shooting more than these revolvers. While not as popular as later wheel guns they were carried by some notables of the time like Little Billy.

The gun is fantastic to look at but when you get behind the wheel and shoot it you can run into the dreaded jammed cylinder: squeeze of a round or two and the cylinder locks up tight—not the idea way to finish with a clean match.

After posting on the SASS Wire for help we found that the arbor (non-removable cylinder pin of the gun) is actually too short—Uberti has been making this way forever it turns out. Also the cylinder gate actually protrudes into the path of the cartridge rims. The first problem pretty much removes any clearance between frame and cylinder while the loading gate stops cylinder rotation = jammed gun.

Good news is both are easy to fix: drop a #10 washer into the arbor hole before reassembling the pistol. This will add enough length to give you the proper cylinder gap, cheap and easy to do.

The gate problem is handled with a Dremel[®] Tool and sanding drum. After being sure the gate spring screw is tight just close the gate and feel if it goes too far forward—this would be at the top of the gate. Grind or sand off a bit and check again. Nice thing is you can do this without removing anything from the frame—if you're slow and careful it should take you less than 3 minutes.

And there you have it: a quick, cheap and easy way to get the Open top revolver match-ready for a *return to those thrilling days of yesteryear*.
