- Our office building is in need of lots of love as well.


If you can swing a hammer, run a paint roller, run a saw, make sandwiches, or give moral support join us on an upcoming work day.

- ▶ Registration Form is attached for you early birds. Also a list of categories from which to choose. You can drop the completed form at the match Saturday or mail them.
- ▶ Big Raffle Items: Rusty Reb and his child-bride Janda will be donating another quilt for LSTR. It will be a patchwork Texas Flag. This will be a standalone raffle for this one great item

We also have a Henry .22 rifle and Ruger revolver to raffle. Details will follow once we've made them up.

▶ Our general raffle will have a number of items for your consideration. Each item will have its own bag in front of it and you can put as many raffle tickets in as you wish. You can spread them out or dump them all in one bag—a chance for you to be 'master of your own fate."

We will be selling the tickets by the Stretch; a length of tickets as long as our ticket sellers can spread their hands apart for the mere fee of \$20—no chickens or children accepted. Go nuts and buy several strings, our club benefits from the proceeds.

If you have items to donate for the general raffle you can drop them off early or bring them as late as Saturday, Dec 5. See one of the officers or Suzie Q.

▶ Registrations: all forms are either sent by snail mail or given to Osage or me (Osage is in it for the money, I keep track of the categories and 'shoot with whomever' info.) If I get it by snail mail I'll send you a conformation so

you'll know your form didn't get lost among all the mail-in election ballots that may or may not make it in time.

Periodically I'll be sending out a list of entrants and their categories. This lets you see how the match attendance is coming together and allows the late comers to 'judiciously' pick the categories.

► Cowboy Swap Meet at LSTR: one of the events included in the price is a chance to exchange stuff you've had forever and don't use with others' stuff they've had forever, etc.



Rules are simple: provide your own table or

work out of the back of your truck/car. Big signs are fine to let folks know what you've got but <u>no fireworks</u>—this ain't California nor a gender-reveal party. All transactions are between you and the seller/buyer. Cash is King here.

No fees or anything to club for this chance to unload your goodies.

▶ Friday Side Matches: in a nutshell this is shooting each type of gun in a certain pattern as fast and safely as you can. You can enter any and all and keep shooting till you're satisfied (or out of ammo.)

You go to the stage building that is hosting the event you want to enter and get in line if there is one. When your turn comes you follow the Judges' instructions (example: with rifle in hand ATB engage the 5 targets in a Double Tap Sweep). If you beat the previous fastest time you get your name and time on the list; if not you can try again or move on to other(s).

We'll be looking for judges for these side matches. Main requirements is you can read, write and push the button on the timer. Hopefully we can get two per stage building so the judges can trade off and do some shooting of their own.

At the Awards Ceremony the fastest shooters for each match will get recognized and receive a certificate or handshake . . . maybe a picture with **Cherokee**.

► Saturday Grub: As is our tradition we will be cooking burgers and hot dogs for the shooters and any "extra meal folks." Both Sweet and plain tea is also provided. The cost is part of your entry fee.

For your Vegans/Vegetarians in our group it might be helpful to remember that if you trace the origin of these main course items back a-ways you will come to grass which is OK for your diets and personal life choices.

We are asking that each shooter bring a side dish or dessert. There will be 'some' electricity available but extension cords would be good to bring. Please label all your cookery and other items so they don't end up in next year's swap meet.

All this goes to show you our members are getting finished much quicker than they did back in the Dark Ages. Nicely done, guys!








From the Reloading Room: a while back I mentioned changing out the rubber on the rollers of my wet media tumbling base. The OEM rubber tubing finally gave up the ghost so I could use my new, bight read tubing that was way cheaper than what the replacement parts cost from the company.

Found out some things while doing this: my tubing's I.D. is a hair smaller than the steel rod so I had to use a lubricant; I opted for floor wax but I'm betting grease would be a good product too.

I takes a bit of effort to force the tubing onto the rod even with the wax. I can be done but it's not a quick and easy task. Next time I'll see if warming the tubing in hot water would help.

The picture shows I didn't completely replace the long roller—just the part where the drum rides on.

I'll report on how well does in the coming months.
